

Essential Vocabulary

Word	Туре	Definition	Example			
Swing	Noun	A seat that hangs down from a metal frame by means of ropes or chains. The objective is to sit on the seat as it moves forwards and backwards through the air.	Wow! There are six swings in this park!			
Birds nest swing / Nest swing	Noun	A large circular swing, with a solid outer ring filled in with webbed or criss-crossed netting or ropes. Multiple people can use this swing at the same time. It resembles a birds' nest, which is how it got its name.	Your sister is on the birds nest swing. Do you want to get on it with her?			
Inclusive swing	Noun	A swing designed specifically for children who are unable to use a traditional flat or curved swing seat. These swings are often chair-like and hung from a metal frame by 4 separate chains.	Sweetie, please leave the inclusive swing free for those who need it.			
Toddler swing / Baby swing / Bucket swing	Noun	A swing that resembles a bucket, that supports children in an upright position. It has leg holes and sometimes a harness or safety belt to keep kids from falling out. Your brother wants to the baby swing. Do you to push him, gently?				
Springy / Spring rider / Spring rocker	Noun	A seat, hand bars and foot rest (often in the shape of an animal or vehicle), that sit on a large spring and rock backwards and forwards or side to side.	What is this springy? Is it a motorbike?			
Spring	Noun	A spiral of metal which returns to its original shape and position after it is pressed, pushed or pulled.	Can you see the big spring under the springy's seat?			
To swing	Verb	The motion of repeatedly moving backwards and forwards, or from side to side.	Honey, swing your legs backwards and forwards to make the swing move.			
To push	Verb	To move an object away from you or away from it's initial position, using force.	Would you like me to push you on the swing?			
To pull	Verb	To move an object towards you or away from its original position, using force.	I'm going to pull the swing back, then let it go, OK?			
To go higher	Phrasal verb	To move into a position above the one you're originally in.	Do you want to go higher?			
To go lower	Phrasal verb	To move into a position below the one you're originally in. OK, if you want to go I won't push you so har

Word	Туре	Definition	Example		
To be careful	Phrasal verb	To pay attention to what you are doing, in order to avoid harm, damage, or mistakes.	Darling, you know I don't like you standing on the springy. Please be careful!		
To keep away from	Phrasal verb	To maintain a distance from somewhere, something or someone.	Honey, keep away from the swings please. They could swing back and hurt you.		
To keep your distance	Phrasal verb	To avoid going near somewhere, something or someone.	Please be careful and keep your distance from the swings.		
To stand back from	Phrasal verb	To keep or move a short distance away from somewhere, something or someone.	Stand back from the swings sweetie, you're far too close.		
Rubber tile	Noun	A thin, usually square or rectangular piece of rubber, used as flooring in many playgrounds.	Watch out! The rubber tiles underneath the springy are broken.		
Concrete	Noun	A very hard material made by mixing together cement, sand, small stones, and water. Often used for playground flooring.	Don't slide along the floor here please, it's concrete. You'll scratch your knees!		
Grass	Noun	A green plant that grows naturally. It has very thin leaves that grow close together in large numbers. Often found in and around playgrounds.	I love the grass at this playground, it's so green and soft!		
Artificial grass	Noun	A synthetic material made to simulate the look and feel of real grass. Often found in and around playgrounds.	Why don't you play on the artificial grass over there?		
Gravel	Noun	Very small stones, often mixed with sand, used for paths, and in playgrounds and parks.	Sweetie, please don't fill your pockets up with gravel!		
Sand	Noun	Tiny grains of rock. Sand is found at the beach, in sandpits and as flooring in some playgrounds.	Oh dear! Are your shoes full of sand?		
Woodchip	Noun	A very small piece of wood.	I love that this playground has woodchip flooring!

Idiom	Definition	Example
To get in(to) the swing of things	To finally feel comfortable with something and begin to enjoy it or do it better.	You're really getting into the swing of things now! It looks like you're having a wonderful time at the playground.
Swings and roundabouts	When the negative aspects of a certain situation are balanced out by the positive aspects (or vice versa).	The "pirate playground" is further away, but the "ship playground" is smaller. So it's swings and roundabouts really
No room to swing a cat	Used to describe a very small or cramped space.	Jeez! The playground is packed today! There's no room to swing a cat!
